Duties and Responsibilities of Command Staff

Purpose: To instruct command staff members in their duties and responsibilities.

Command staff

The command staff consists of the following personnel:

- Commanding officer
- Executive officer
- Northern east district captain
- Northern west district captain
- Central district captain
- Eastern district captain
- Western district captain
- Superior district captain

The following lists the duties and responsibilities of each staff position:

Commanding Officer

- Holds the rank of colonel
- Elected to a one (1) year term by majority vote of the general membership
- Responsible for the appointment of all other command staff members
- Along with other command staff members approves appointment of all other officers within the Michigan Home Guard
- Oversees the daily operations of the Michigan Home Guard
- Is an admin on all Michigan Home Guard related pages on the internet
- Responsible for the overall readiness of the Michigan Home Guard
- Responsible with the entire command staff for all operational and contingency planning
- Responsible for setting up additional departments within the Michigan Home Guard that are necessary for it's mission fulfillment
- Chairs all disciplinary hearings and appeals hearings within the Michigan Home Guard
- Responsible with other members of the command staff for the writing, review and updating of new and existing field manuals
- Oversees and directs BOARDS of special teams as needed

Executive Officer

- Holds the rank of major
- Be prepared to assume commanding officers duties at anytime
- Oversees all admin functions of Michigan Home Guard
- Serves as a member of disciplinary and appeals boards
- Oversees and coordinates activities of the six districts at a state level
- Assists in recruiting of new personnel
- Serves as an admin on all Michigan Home Guard related pages on the internet
- Advises commanding officer in selection of personnel to oversee new departments
- Maintains service records
- Maintains an up to date table of organization

Assists commanding officer with oversight of all Michigan Home Guard activities
Responsible with other members of the command staff for the writing, review and updating of new and existing field manuals
Responsible for overseeing entire command staff for all operational and contingency planning
Along with other command staff members, approves appointment of all other officers within the Michigan Home Guard
Responsible for drawing up Michigan Home Guard training plan
Oversees and directs BOARDS of special teams as needed

Captain

Responsible for overseeing all Michigan Home Guard activities within their district
Responsible for recruiting and vetting new members
Oversees proper operation and administration of their district
Appoints sector lieutenants with commanding officer's approval
Approves county sergeant appointments as made by sector lieutenants
Submits reports as necessary
Train sector lieutenants in their duties
Ensure training within the district is being carried out in accordance with training plan
Serves as a member of disciplinary and appeals boards
Coordinates and conducts operational and contingency planning within their districts in conjunction with state planning
Conduct at least one (1) district training per year
Ensures compliance and implementation of medical, communications and logistical planning at district level
Ensure that sector lieutenants have all information and material necessary for fulfillment of their responsibilities

SECTOR LIEUTENANT:

LIEUTENANT APPOINTMENT BY CAPTAINS DISCRETION
DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE SECTOR LIEUTENANT.

HOLDS THE RANK OF 1ST LIEUTENANT
THE SECTOR LIEUTENANT CANNOT HOLD A COMMAND POSITION IN ANY
OTHER PATRIOT GROUP
OVERSEES ALL MICHIGAN HOME GUARD ACTIVITIES WITHIN THEIR SECTOR
RESPONSIBLE FOR APPOINTING COUNTY SERGEANTS WITH THE DISTRICT
CAPTAINS APPROVAL
RESPONSIBLE TO HOLD AT LEAST ONE SECTOR WIDE TRAINING PER
QUARTER
ENSURE THAT COUNTY SERGEANTS ARE TRAINED IN THEIR DUTIES AND
RESPONSIBILITIES
RESPONSIBLE TO ENSURE TRAINING IN THEIR SECTOR IS HELD IN
ACCORDANCE WITH STATE TRAINING PLAN
SUBMIT ALL REPORTS AS NECESSARY
RESPONSIBLE TO ENSURE GOOD ORDER AND DISCIPLINE WITHIN THEIR
SECTOR
RECRUIT AND VET NEW MEMBERS
RESPONSIBLE TO ASSIST COUNTY SERGEANTS WITH TRAINING BY
PROVIDING NECESSARY INFORMATION
RESPONSIBLE TO ENSURE THAT THEIR SECTOR IS READY TO CARRY OUT
OPERATIONAL AND CONTINGENCY OPERATIONS
ENSURE MEDICAL, COMMUNICATION AND LOGISTICAL DEPARTMENTS IN
THEIR SECTOR ARE COORDINATING WITH STATE LEVEL COUNTERPARTS
ASSIST COUNTY SERGEANTS IN LOCATING TRAINING LOCATIONS
IT IS THEIR DUTY TO LEAD BY EXAMPLE AND TRAIN WITH THEIR SECTOR
TO MAINTAIN CONTACT WITH COUNTY SERGEANTS IN THEIR SECTOR AT
LEAST ONCE A WEEK
TO ASSURE WEEKLY ROLL CALLS ARE HELD BY THEIR SERGEANTS IN THEIR
SECTORS
TO ENSURE THAT SECTOR MEMBERS ARE INVOLVED AND ACTIVE IN SOME
CAPACITY

COUNTY SERGEANT:

SERGEANT APPOINTMENT BY CAPTAIN AND LIEUTENANT.
DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF COUNTY SERGEANT.

THE COUNTY SERGEANT HAS A SPECIAL RESPONSIBILITY. AS THE EYES AND EARS OF THE COMMAND STAFF THEY NEED TO REPORT PROBLEMS OR OTHER ISSUES TO THE COMMAND STAFF TO ENSURE THAT THEY ARE HANDLED IN A TIMELY MANNER.

RANK IS SERGEANT
RESPONSIBLE FOR OVERSEEING ALL MICHIGAN HOME GUARD ACTIVITY
WITHIN THEIR COUNTY
RESPONSIBLE TO WORK WITH SECTOR LIEUTENANT TO FIND A SUITABLE
TRAINING AREA
RESPONSIBLE TO ENSURE THAT TRAINING IS CONDUCTED IN ACCORDANCE
WITH STATE TRAINING PLAN
SUBMIT REPORTS AS NEEDED
RESPONSIBLE TO ENSURE THAT MEMBERS ARE EQUIPPED PROPERLY
RESPONSIBLE FOR ENSURING THAT ALL MEMBERS IN THE COUNTY ARE
ACTIVE AND INVOLVED IN SOME CAPACITY
RESPONSIBLE FOR ENSURING MEDICAL, COMMUNICATION AND LOGISTICAL
PLANNING IN THEIR COUNTY IS IN ACCORDANCE WITH STATE LEVEL
PLANNING
MAINTAIN REGULAR CONTACT WITH MEMBERS IN THEIR COUNTY TO
INCLUDE A WEEKLY ROLL CALL AND PHONE CONTACT LIST
ENSURE MEMBERS ARE AWARE OF MICHIGAN HOME GUARD ACTIVITIES AND
THEIR INVOLVEMENT IN THOSE ACTIVITIES
RESPONSIBLE FOR HELPING TO RECRUIT NEW MEMBERS AND TO VET THEM
RESPONSIBLE FOR FORMING MEMBERS INTO 4 PERSON TEAMS AND
INSTRUCTING EACH MEMBER IN THEIR DUTY
RESPONSIBLE FOR DESIGNATING AT LEAST 3 RALLY POINTS WITH THEIR
COUNTY
RESPONSIBLE FOR OBTAINING INTELLIGENCE OF POTENTIAL THREATS TO
THE MICHIGAN HOME GUARD WITHIN THEIR COUNTY
RESPONSIBLE FOR ENSURING THAT MEMBERS IN THEIR COUNTY FOLLOW
THE MICHIGAN HOME GUARD BYLAWS AND MAINTAIN GOOD ORDER AND
DISCIPLINE
ENSURE THAT NO ILLEGAL ACTIVITY OCCURS AT MICHIGAN HOME GUARD
RELATED EVENTS...THIS INCLUDES ILLEGAL WEAPONS, INCITEMENT TO
COMMIT VIOLENCE OR OTHER ACTIVITIES THAT WOULD BRING DISCREDIT TO
THE MICHIGAN HOME GUARD

COUNTY CORPORAL:

ONCE THE COUNTY HAS REACHED 6 ACTIVE MEMBERS, ADDITIONAL CORPORAL ADDED AFTER EVERY 10 MEMBERS.
DUTY IS TO ASSIST THE SERGEANT.

BOARDS:

SOME SPECIAL MHG TEAMS SUCH AS; COMMUNICATIONS, MEDICAL HAVE A "BOARD", MADE UP OF MEMBERS THAT WORK TOGETHER TO DIRECT AND FURTHER ADVANCE THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THEIR TEAM.
THESE BOARDS ARE OVERSEEN AND OPERATE AS DIRECTED BY THE CO AND/OR XO

RIFLE TEAM MEMBER REQUIREMENTS

PURPOSE: TO HELP RIFLE TEAM MEMBERS BE PREPARED AND “COMBAT READY” WITH AN ESTABLISHED STANDARD OF SKILL AND KNOWLEDGE SO AS TO BE CAPABLE OF EFFECTIVELY OPERATING AS A TEAM IN THE FIELD.

RECRUITS

THIS IS THE RANK FOR THOSE WHO HAVE PASSED VETTING AND ARE IN THEIR PROBATIONARY PERIOD AND/OR HAVE NOT MET RIFLEMAN REQUIREMENTS. THESE MEMBERS MUST DO M-1 RIFLEMAN TRAINING IN ORDER TO BE ASSIGNED TO A RIFLE TEAM. THIS LEVEL WOULD ALSO BE ASSIGNED AS THE ENTRY LEVEL FOR THOSE WHO RESPOND IN THE EVENT OF A REAL CALL UP.

R-1 RIFLEMAN

BASIC MICHIGAN HOME GUARD MILITIAMAN
MUST PARTICIPATE IN THE TRAINING OF RECRUITS
HAS ATTAINED R-1 TRAINING AND EQUIPMENT STANDARDS.
CAN OPERATE UNSUPPORTED IN THE FIELD FOR A 24HR PERIOD.

THE M.H.G NAME TAPE WILL GO OVER LEFT BREAST POCKET. NAME TAPE WILL GO OVER THE RIGHT. LAST NAMES OR CALL SIGNS ARE ALLOWED.

CAN OPERATE UNSUPPORTED IN THE FIELD FOR A 72 HOUR PERIOD.

Field and Base Communications

PURPOSE: TO ESTABLISH A STANDARD OF KNOWLEDGE, EQUIPMENT AND OPERATIONAL GUIDELINES FOR RADIO OPERATORS IN THE FIELD AND AT AN ESTABLISHED BASE CAMP TO COMMUNICATE EFFECTIVELY LOCALLY, ACROSS THE STATE AND BEYOND.

RIFLE TEAM RADIO TELEPHONE OPERATOR (RTO)

LEVEL 1 RTO

AIDSMEN, MEDICS, IFAKS

OVERVIEW

FIELD MEDICS ARE AN ESSENTIAL TOOL ON THE BATTLEFIELD. THEY ARE USED IN THE TREATMENT OF BATTLEFIELD INJURIES, AND ARE ALSO RESPONSIBLE FOR THE QUALITY AND CARE OF THE MILITIAMAN. THIS CARE COULD BE ANYTHING FROM TRAUMATIC INJURIES TO ENVIRONMENTAL AND CHRONIC FATIGUE CONCERNS. THE MHG OPERATES THREE LEVELS OF MEDICAL PERSONNEL. THEY ARE: M-1 (AIDSMAN), M-2 (FIELD MEDIC), M-3 (MEDICAL SUPPORT SPECIALIST). WHILE THE M-1 DOES NOT REQUIRE A MEDICAL LICENSE TO QUALIFY, THE M-2 AND M-3 QUALIFICATIONS DO REQUIRE A CIVILIAN MEDICAL LICENSE TO BE ABLE TO TO PREFORM INVASIVE TECHNIQUES. M-1's ASSIGNED TO A RIFLE TEAM ARE ALSO REQUIRED TO MEET R-1 REQUIREMENTS. M-2's AND M-3's ASSIGNED TO A RIFLE TEAM ARE REQUIRED TO AT A MINIMUM MEET P-1 REQUIREMENTS.

M-1 (AIDSMAN)

THIS IS THE ENTRY LEVEL MEDICAL DESIGNATION FOR THE MICHIGAN HOME GUARD. NO FORMAL TRAINING IS REQUIRED TO BE CERTIFIED AS AN AIDSMAN, EXCEPT THROUGH THE COURSE OF REGULAR TRAININGS AND A DEMONSTRATION OF SKILLS. THE AIDSMAN'S RESPONSIBILITIES INCLUDE THE ADMINISTRATION OF AID TO FALLEN MILITIAMEN AT A LEVEL OF ADVANCED FIRST AID.

M-2 FIELD MEDIC

THE M-2 FIELD MEDIC IS REQUIRED TO OBTAIN AND MAINTAIN A CIVILIAN MEDICAL LICENSE, EITHER AN EMT, PARAMEDIC, OR A NURSING LICENSE FOR LEGAL PURPOSES. THE CARE PROVIDED BY THE FIELD MEDIC INCLUDES BUT NOT LIMITED TO ADVANCED AIRWAYS, ADVANCED TRAUMA

CARE, MEDICAL ILLNESS TREATMENT, AND GENERAL CARE AND WELLBEING OF THE MILITIAMAN.

PRIMARY FORCES MEDIC MEMBER

MUST ASSIST IN THE TRAINING OF M1'S THROUGH THE BUDDY SYSTEM OR ONE-ON-ONE INTERACTIVE TRAINING.

HAS MET ALL M-1 & M-2 TRAINING AND REQUIREMENT STANDARDS.

MUST HAVE AN EMT, PARAMEDIC, OR NURSING LICENSE.

CAN OPERATE AT A MINIMUM OF SQUAD LEVEL OF CARE

M-3 MEDICAL SUPPORT SPECIALIST

THIS LEVEL OPERATES IN PARALLEL WITH THE DETACHED OR BASE CAMP RTO, TO HAVE THE NECESSARY INFORMATION TO SETUP AND EQUIP A MEDICAL TRIAGE AREA AT THE DETACHED LOCATION. THIS LEVEL REQUIRES A MEDICAL LICENSE, PREFERABLY AN EMT, PARAMEDIC, OR NURSE. A CNA, PCT OR MEDICAL ASSISTANT MAY ALSO BE ABLE TO PERFORM AT THIS LEVEL IF CLEARED BY THE DISTRICT MEDIC, AS THIS LEVEL HAS A LOW PROBABILITY OF ACUTE AND CRITICAL TREATMENT INTERVENTION.

SECONDARY FORCES MEDIC MEMBER
MUST ASSIST IN THE TRAINING OF M1'S THROUGH THE BUDDY SYSTEM OR ONE-ON-ONE INTERACTIVE TRAINING.
HAS MET ALL M-1 & M-2 TRAINING AND REQUIREMENT STANDARDS.
PREFERRED TO HAVE AN EMT, PARAMEDIC, OR NURSING LICENSE, BUT OTHER LEVELS MAY BE APPROVED BY DISTRICT MEDIC.
PROVIDES MID TO LONG TERM CARE IN LOW-RISK ZONE.

GUNSHOT WOUNDS, AMPUTATIONS, AND BROKEN BONES. IT IS DISCOURAGED TO KEEP NON-LIFE SAVING EQUIPMENT IN THIS KIT. LEVEL 1 KITS WILL BE USED BY THE INDIVIDUAL MEMBER TO TREAT TRAUMA.
